(U//FOUO) **Scope**


(U//FOUO) This *Reference Aid* provides an overview of Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (ISIL)-associated activity in the United States between January 2014 and December 2015 linked to US persons (USPERs) assessed to be inspired by the group. This analysis is derived exclusively from open source material, including criminal complaints and federal indictments. It is intended to inform state, local, tribal, and territorial government and law enforcement officials and private sector partners about the wide range of ISIL-inspired activities in the Homeland, and provide insight into emerging terrorist trends, which may aid in the detection and prevention of future terrorist activities. This product does not include any information about USPERs believed to be abroad or about the July 2015 attack against military facilities in Chattanooga, Tennessee, which is still under investigation.



(U//FOUO) This Homeland Security Reference Aid (HSRA) updates the version previously published in October 2015. It depicts the number and geographic dispersal of US-based persons' alleged terrorism-related activities in the United States since the beginning of January 2014, who are assessed to be inspired by the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (ISIL). Since the last update, we have added six individuals to the chart. DHS I&A analysis of 71 individuals dating from the beginning of January 2014 through the end of December 2015 indicates that although most range from 24 to 28 years old there is otherwise no specific profile, with suspected terrorists varying in ethnic background and geographic location. It also highlights that arrestees have been involved in a range of terrorism-related activities, to include successful attacks, traveling abroad with the intent to join ISIL; providing domestic material support to the group; and aspirational or advanced attack planning on behalf of ISIL. The majority of those arrested for ISIL-inspired activities over the last 24 months have been arrested for failed travel, although since October activities have been primarily focused on terrorist activity within the US compared to going abroad. Analysis shows the majority of those arrested or fatally shot for ISIL-inspired activities are male; however, one female has been a part of a successful attack. This is the first female participant in a successful ISIL-inspired attack in the Homeland.


(U//FOUO) The San Bernardino shooters are included in this graphic because one of them pledged allegiance to ISIL following the attack, although they both were radicalized prior to the creation of the group and the FBI's investigation has not yielded evidence that the attack was done in furtherance of ISIL ideology. The terrorist attack in Chattanooga, TN is not depicted within this HSRA because the investigation has not determined a link to ISIL. This graphic also does not include US-based individuals who are believed to have successfully traveled to Syria to join ISIL or those who may have been killed there.

(U) Age & Activities of US ISIL-Inspired Individuals





(U) Disrupted ISIL Activity in the United States, January 2014 – December 2015





*(U//FOUO) The analysis in this Reference Aid about ISIL-inspired activity between January 2014 and December 2015 is based on open source reporting, including criminal complaints and federal indictments. We have **high confidence** in our analysis of each individual's type of activity and stated intent to conduct an attack on behalf of the group, as the government information is considered **highly reliable** and much of the open source reporting has been corroborated.*
